- 2. This does not cover costs for re-sampling animals due to poor sample quality. This shouldn't be an issue as these are generally not charged. Neogen will not attempt to run a sample that is obviously contaminated or otherwise unusable.
- 3. Covering the costs for a retest is for a TSU sample only. TSUs appear to have lower failure rates than other sample types and this will encourage use of TSUs rather than blood or hair cards.
- 4. Committee believes ASA covering these costs this will greatly improve member satisfaction and is an example of ASA's commitment to great customer service.
